What is RCPP?

The Regional Conservation Partnership
Program (RCPP) promotes coordination of
NRCS conservation activities with partners
that offer value-added contributions to expand
our collective ability to address on-farm,
watershed, and regional natural resource
concerns. Through RCPP, NRCS seeks to
co-invest with partners to implement projects
that demonstrate innovative solutions
to conservation challenges and provide
measurable improvements and outcomes tied
to the resource concerns they seek to address.

Project

This project aims to expand work with individual farm operators to use precision ag tools for conservation planning and improving farm soil health practices. It will also address gaps in infrastructure for livestock farmers by incorporating practices to bridge overall infrastructure needs. The goal is to expand the project to two additional areas and engage over 250 individual farmers/landowners while providing technical and financial assistance.

Eligible Practices

The project establishes an approach for private sector conservation planning support for practices such as:

- · Conservation Cover
- Cover Crops
- Crop Rotation
- Fence
- Grade Stabilization Structure
- Pasture and Hay Planting
- Watering Facility


