Dec 2021 – Kick off of the Big Game Pilot which is now a full-blown WLFW Initiative -Key Components:

Conservation Practices (EQIP)

Conservation Lease (grassland CRP)

Permanent Ag Land protection (ACEP-ALE) Increased coordination

between USDA and State of WY

MOU with USDA/WY Governor encourages FSA to utilize grassland CRP for BG Conservation.

Grassland Conservation Reserve Program (CRP)

- -FSA working land program- grazing or having is allowed
 - -Under the CRP "Umbrella"
 - -No cropping history requirement
- 10 15-year rental contracts
 - -Per acre rental rate-\$14-\$19/acre in WY. Large increase from a few years ago.
- -Cost share policy- FSA can provide assistance on a small sub-set of conservation practices. No cost-share available for brush management or herbaceous weed control. EQIP can provide assistance on many more practices.
 - -FSA program
- -NRCS provides technical assistance and conservation planning for grassland CRP. Environmental Factors have been tweaked for BG to prioritize properties in important BG areas of WY.

State CRP Wildlife Priorities (primarily tied to General CRP)

State Priority Grassland Zone; vastly expanded to prioritize much of WY.

National CRP priority zone. Expanded to included NW WY.

A lot more interest in the program and a lot more accepted offers in WY.

Moving Forward –

Waiting on the Final waiver for FY 23. Working on a more permanent solution. FY 24 grassland CRP Sign-up forthcoming (likely this spring)
